2021 ACTIVITIES REVIEW

- Continue [Joint programme](#) (2020-2030), a collaboration of OHCHR, UNFPA, UNECE and WHO in Eastern Europe and Central Asia (EECA) region on the rights, health and dignity of older people.¹
- Continue advocacy on what data will be needed for the Decade.³

THEME 2: PROGRAMMING

Framing: How can we leverage the Decade to advance healthy ageing in country plans and programmes including Cooperation Frameworks?

2021 ACTIVITIES REVIEW

- WHO and ILO collaborated to raise awareness about ageism in employment through the international premiere of the documentary film 'Duty Free'.
- WHO, OHCHR, UNDESA and UNFPA **launched the first UN global report on ageism and** collaborated to raise awareness about ageism at the 11th session of the Open-Ended Working Group on ageing.
- UN RC in Serbia championed work on ageism with regional launch of the Global Report on Ageism in Europe and Central Asia, supported by UNFPA and WHO collaboration.
- DCO, DESA, WHO, OHCHR contributed to identifying how the rights of older persons can be considered in CCAs and CFs as part of the DCO consultation process.
- **WHO developed regional frameworks to implement the Decade and provided technical advice on strategies and plans for AFRO and country plans in Kenya and Pakistan.**
- **WHO** mapped country support needs for technical advice in the implementation of the Decade.
- Joint programme (OHCHR, UNFPA, UNECE, WHO) in EECA region ([UNFPA EECA | Ageing Programme](#))
- COVAX is co-led by Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI), Gavi, and WHO with UNICEF to accelerate COVID-19 vaccine development and manufacture and guarantee fair and equitable access for every country. WHO vaccine colleagues are open to collaborate, to strengthen inclusion of older people.
- SG's report for the 2021 General Assembly provided an analysis of the impact of the COVID-19 on older people and serves to explore pathways to ensure that older persons are better incorporated into efforts to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic in various policy areas. It also featured selected work carried out by the UN system on ageing and older people, with key recommendations.
- Joint programme (OHCHR, UNFPA, UNECE, WHO) in EECA region ([UNFPA EECA | Ageing Programme](#))⁴.
- **WHO, ILO and OECD presented at an ISSA webinar on long-term care challenge and international strategies.**
- **OECD presented on long-term care workforce at WHO European region's long-term care forum.**

2022 PRIORITY ACTIONS

- WHO and ILO to explore collaborations on ageism and long-term care. **Other agencies are encouraged to join.** OHCHR expressed interested where there is a strong field presence.
- Map & review operational guidance for UN Common Country Assessments (CCAs) and UN Sustainable Development Cooperation Frameworks (SDCFs), consult with WHO Country Strategy and Support and WHO in UN New York.
- Engage with UN Women on caregiving and women's unpaid work as carers to inform caregivers training module (WHO technical product).
- Provide technical assistance to countries developing or updating national plans in line with the Decade: e.g. WHO and UNDP to support the development of the Cambodia national plan.
- **Sensitise Resident Coordinators, UN Country Teams and WHO Representatives on the Decade and tools available for its implementation – e.g. [ICOPE and the National Guidance for developing Age-friendly communities \(Under development\)](#).**
- Conduct consultation with older people and caregivers on the development of the long-term care service package.

Is there a way we can enhance?

2021 ACTIVITIES REVIEW

- DCO, UNDESA, WHO and OHCHR contributed to identifying how the rights of older persons can be considered in CCAs and CFs as part of the DCO consultation process.
- COVAX is co-led by Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI), Gavi, and WHO with UNICEF to accelerate the development and manufacture of COVID-19 vaccines, and to guarantee fair and equitable access for every country in the world. WHO vaccine colleagues are open to collaborate.
- WHO mapping of country support needs for technical advice in the implementation of the Decade.
- Cross UN technical support for the development of Secretary General's report for the General Assembly 2021 [\[provide link\]](#). Report provides an analysis of the impact of the COVID-19 on older persons and serves to explore pathways to ensure that older persons are better incorporated into efforts to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic in various policy areas. It also features selected work carried out by the UN system on ageing and older persons. The report contains key recommendations for consideration by the Assembly.
- OHCHR developed disaggregation of age cohorts in line with the Humanitarian Inclusion Standards for older persons and persons with disabilities into the guidance for the development of Refugee Response Plans.
- Joint programme with UNFPA, UNECE and OHCHR in EECA region ([UNFPA EECA | Ageing Programme](#)).
- **Developing monitoring and evaluation framework for the UN Decade of Healthy Ageing – led by WHO**

2022 PRIORITY ACTIONS

- **Progress the work on the National toolkit for monitoring the Decade, including holding meetings to develop the work plan for WHO's next Biennium in conjunction with the UN Steering Group and Technical Advisory Group on Measurement, Monitoring and Evaluation of the Decade.**
- Progress the Technical Advisory Group (TAG) on Measurement, Monitoring and Evaluation of the Decade.
- Continue advocacy on what data will be needed for the Decade.⁵
- **Develop guidance on the disaggregation of data, including for refugees and displaced older people.**
- DESA to provide two background papers on:
 - 1) defining older persons (in collaboration with WHO), and
 - 2) measuring autonomy, participation and contribution of older persons to support Titchfield Group work.
- Work with Programming and Advocacy Themes.

THEME 4: PARTICIPATION

Framing: Can we foster partnerships at country and regional level with older persons? Are there good practices?

2021 ACTIVITIES REVIEW

- Strengthened mechanisms including for MIPAA bottom-up participation through a training workshop in sub-Saharan Africa (Kenya 2021); city halls with participation of older persons.
- Provided support to a group of CSOs to map other organizations working on healthy ageing with a focus on LMIC. They will host in 2022 a colloquium to raise awareness about the Decade and how they may wish to work together (e.g. CSO Forum or alliance) for its implementation (ILO Coalition of CSOs, social protection (more detail?))
- Partnerships to facilitate CSO and representatives of older people in VNRs, CCAs & CFs: can DCO provide?
- Project to catalyze the enabler on hearing diverse voices and enabling meaningful engagement: WHO-led Participatory Video (PV) VOICE pilots in Canada, Jordan and Togo, with funding from Canada. Collaboration with HelpAge International/Network members, and InsightShare. Proof-of-concept piloting.
- [Joint programme](#) (2020-2030), a collaboration of OHCHR, UNFPA, UNECE, WHO, with HelpAge International, in Eastern Europe and Central Asia (EECA) region, on the rights, health and dignity of older people.^{1,5}
- Partnerships for information exchange: UN agencies contributed content to the Decade Platform section on VOICE established and curated by WHO for good practices and dissemination.
- OHCHR, UNDESA, UNFPA and WHO facilitated older peoples' voices at start of HRC Side Event (September) for IDOP, including from PV Voice and other UN projects worldwide.
- Partnerships for guidance and identification of good practices: UNECE ran a workshop on meaningful participation for policy making (April) and published a Guidance Note on the meaningful participation of older persons and civil society in policymaking: designing a stakeholder engagement and participation process (August), with inputs from UNFPA at regional and country levels and WHO (HQ).

2022 PRIORITY ACTIONS

- Build partnerships to strengthen participation mechanisms: e.g. bottom-up participation reporting for MIPAA, 2023 Decade monitoring? Can UNDESA provide?
- Undertake CSO mapping exercises to determine current engagement and inform CSO Forum development.
- Develop plans for a possible Older People's Council as part of the Decade Collaboration .
- Develop partnerships to facilitate CSO and representatives of older people in VNRs, CCAs & CFs. DCO to convene RCs to identify those interested.
- Develop partnerships to strengthen the enabler on hearing diverse voices and enable meaningful engagement, e.g. jointly fund participatory projects in countries planning a VNR or CCA and work with RCs?
- IAGA agencies to contribute resources to Decade Platform section on VOICE curated by WHO.
- IAGA agencies to identify themes for Decade Connection Series Advocacy Briefs and contribute. DESA to act as penholder for [Decade Connection Series](#) Advocacy Brief #4 linking Decade to MIPAA and Our Common Agenda⁵.
- Joint advocacy at key events⁵ (e.g. Voice and Meaningful Engagement, WHO with other agencies)
- Promote and facilitate voices of diverse older people at UN and other events at different levels.
- Organize a film screening of the PV Voice participatory films from Canada, Jordan and Togo led by WHO with reflection on lessons for the voice and meaningful engagement enabler: proposed for 22 March.
- WHO to organize an expert consultation on the Decade enabler of voice and meaningful engagement: what is it and how best to catalyze and strengthen it for all action areas of the Decade?
